




The *HTML <aside> Element* represents a section of a page that consists of content that is tangentially related to the content around it, which could be considered separate from that content. Such sections are often represented as sidebars or as inserts. They often contain side explanations, like a glossary definition; more loosely related stuff, like advertisements; the biography of the author; or in web-applications, profile information or related blog links.

Usage notes:

- Do not use the `<aside>` element to tag parenthesized text, as this kind of text is considered part of the main flow.



Content categories:	Flow content, sectioning content, palpable content.
Permitted content:	Flow content.
Tag omission:	None, both the starting and ending tag are mandatory.
Permitted parent elements:	Any element that accepts flow content. Note that an <code><aside></code> element must not be a descendant of an <code><address></code> element.
DOM interface:	<code>HTMLElement</code>

Qt GUI

The Qt GUI module provides classes for windowing system integration, event handling, OpenGL and OpenGL ES integration, 2D graphics, basic imaging, fonts and text. These classes are used internally by Qt's user interface technologies and can also be used directly, for instance to write applications using low-level OpenGL ES graphics APIs.

For application developers writing user interfaces, Qt provides higher level API's, like Qt Quick, that are much more suitable than the enablers found in the Qt GUI module.

Getting started

To include the definitions of the module's classes, use the following directive:

#include <QtGui>
```

Application Windows

The most important classes in the Qt GUI module are `QGuiApplication` and `QWindow`. A Qt application that wants to show content on screen, will need to make use of these. `QGuiApplication` contains the main event loop, where all events from the window system and other sources are processed and dispatched. It also handles the application's initialization and finalization.

The `QWindow` class represents a window in the underlying windowing system. It provides a number of virtual functions to handle events (`QEvent`) from the windowing system, such as touch-input, exposure, focus, key strokes

It is a [prototype-based, multi-paradigm](#) scripting language that is dynamic, and supports object-oriented, imperative, and functional programming styles.

The JavaScript standard is [ECMAScript](#). As of 2012, all modern browsers fully support ECMAScript 5.1. Older browsers support at least ECMAScript 3. A 6th major revision of the standard is in the works. The current progress of different new and improved features can be followed on the [dedicated wiki](#).

This section of the site is dedicated to the JavaScript language itself, the parts that are not specific to Web pages, or other host environments. For information about APIs specific to Web pages, please see [Document Object Model \(DOM\)](#). Read more about how the DOM and JavaScript fit together in the [DOM Reference](#).



